You will develop important study skills as well as an understanding of accounting, economics, management, marketing and business analytics. Students who complete the Diploma of Business within three trimesters and achieve a minimum 50 per cent WAM (weighted average mark) are guaranteed entry into the second year of the Bachelor of Business or Bachelor of International Business.

Students who complete the Diploma of Business within three trimesters and achieve a minimum 60 per cent WAM are also eligible to progress to the second year of the Bachelor of Accounting.

# MANAGING THE COSTS OF GOING TO UNIVERSITY

Uni costs include the contribution you need to pay towards the overall cost of your course, a compulsory administration fee, money for textbooks and equipment, as well as living expenses.

## COURSE COSTS

## Textbooks

Textbook prices vary widely - some are around the price of an average paperback while others cost as much as \$100 or more. To help you avoid big expenses, all prescribed textbooks are available from the LaTrobe library.

## WHERE TO GET HELP

### Loans to cover course costs: HECS-HELP

You may be eligible for a loan via the government's HECS-HELP scheme which allows you to borrow the amount of your student contribution and pay it back once you're in the workforce and earning more than a certain amount. For the 2015-2016 income year, the compulsory repayment threshold is \$54,126.

### Student loans

If you need help to cover the cost of books, equipment, computer software and hardware, or work placements, you can apply for a student loan.

## How to budget

Budgeting is about knowing your weekly income, calculating how much you need for essentials and what's left over, and setting aside savings for unexpected expenses. Before you start uni, try writing up a weekly or monthly estimate of your income and expenses.

Estimate how much money you'll have each week from your job, parents, Centrelink and/or scholarship and how much you'll spend - include everything! Then work out how much cash you'll need each week for day-to-day expenses, and only ever withdraw this amount. ## NAVITAS FAMILY BURSARY

### 10% reduction on your tuition fee

You'll receive a 10% reduction on your course fees for your entire degree.

If you have an immediate family member studying, or who has previously studied, at a participating Navitas member institution you may be eligible for a 10% reduction on your tuition fee for the duration of your study.

To apply, request an application form from reception and submit it together with supporting documents such as a birth certificate or family card.

## NAVITAS ACADEMIC MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS

### Fees for one academic semester

You'll receive credit for one academic semester during your course.

There is no need to apply, as all full-time enrolled students are automatically eligible. The two students studying a full-time load with the highest Grade Point Average in all subjects or courses will each receive a scholarship. If you are successful, you will be notified by mail once end of term results are released.

# GLOSSARY

## **Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank (ATAR)**

UAC or VTAC gives you an ATAR (a number between 0.00 and 99.95) to rank your Year 12 results against other students' results.

## **Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP)**

Uni places for which the Commonwealth Government pays part of the cost, and you pay a student contribution.

## **Credit points**

Each uni subject is measured in credit points, and each course has a prescribed number of credit points (rather than subjects). Most of LaTrobe's three-year undergraduate degrees are worth 360 credit points.

## **Educational Access Schemes (EAS)**

EAS is a UAC program that may grant some special consideration to your application due to your personal circumstances.

## **HECS-HELP**

An Australian Government loan scheme to help eligible students enrolled in a CSP pay their student contributions.

## **Mature-age**

Anyone aged 21 or over by 31 December in the year they will commence their studies.

## **Postgraduate**

The second level of study at uni. Usually, you can only do postgraduate studies once you've completed an undergraduate degree.

## **Prerequisites**

The subjects you must have completed at school (and/or any other qualifications you must have) to be eligible for a place in a specific uni course.

## **Undergraduate**

The first level of study at uni. This usually refers to a three-year single bachelor's degree (although it also includes honours studies, which can take an additional year, plus there are double degrees which usually take at least four years full-time).

## **Universities Admission Centre (UAC)**

UAC processes applications for admission to most undergraduate courses at participating institutions (mainly located in NSW and the ACT).

## **Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC)**

VTAC is the central office that administers the application processes for places in tertiary courses, scholarships and the Special Entry Access Scheme at universities, TAFEs and independent tertiary colleges in Victoria (and a few outside Victoria).



